MEDVIEW Engages Stakeholders Across Europe



Between 8 September and 14 October 2025, MEDVIEW partner - the University of Maribor (UM) hosted and co-organized a series of international events showcasing the role of artificial intelligence (AI) and digital technologies in healthcare and public engagement, with MEDVIEW playing a key part. The program began with the five-day event "From AI Research to Clinical Implementation" (8–12 September) in Maribor, Slovenia, bringing together 70 participants from across Europe to explore AI in cancer care, policy perspectives, regulatory frameworks, clinical trials, ethical considerations, and commercialization opportunities.

Through workshops, presentations, and discussions, the event bridged the gap between research and clinical practice, highlighting the importance of multidisciplinary collaboration in translating AI innovations into real-world solutions.

Building on this, UM organized hands-on VR workshops at Dom Nine Pokorn Grmovje, engaging



both healthcare staff and citizens and caregivers. Participants learned to use VR applications to stimulate cognition, enhance focus, and provide immersive experiences for elderly residents, including those with dementia. The series culminated in a hybrid public session "AI, Democracy, and the Public Interest – Building Resilient Digital Futures" on 14 October in Ljubljana, where MEDVIEW, alongside Horizon Europe projects Solaris, TWON, and AI4Gov, explored AI's role in democratic processes, digital resilience, and citizen empowerment.

Across all events, MEDVIEW's WP2 activities facilitated stakeholder engagement, co-creation, and knowledge exchange, shaping the project's

stakeholder engagement strategy and partnership framework while demonstrating its commitment to inclusivity, societal relevance, and real-world impact in healthcare and digital governance.



Unlocking Values Workshops info

We are deeply thankful to all who joined the Unlocking Values Workshops at the end of 2025. Your contributions are leaving a lasting imprint on MEDVIEW, shaping our approach and offering insights that will support not only this project but also wider efforts to embed values-based, co-created solutions in health innovation. Across the workshops, participants shared thoughtful, grounded reflections on what truly enables meaningful collaboration in health innovation. One of the most striking insights was the emphasis on emotional safety as a prerequisite for honest dialogue and genuine co-creation. People expressed that they can only contribute openly (especially when sharing lived experience or professional vulnerability) when they feel respected, not judged, and confident that their input will be valued and used responsibly. This was not presented as an abstract ideal but as a

practical condition for effective partnership, echoed consistently across all stakeholder groups.

The workshops also highlighted clear opportunities for MEDVIEW to embed these values into its processes, tools, and long-term governance. Participants identified ways to strengthen inclusivity, reduce barriers to engagement, and ensure that diverse voices shape decision-making from the outset. Everyone's contributions have already informed the design of MEDVIEW partnership framework that is operationally strong, ethically grounded, and genuinely human-centred. The insights will continue to guide the MEDVIEW project in its aim to create an environment where co-creation and knowledge valorisation thrive.



Strengthening Knowledge Valorisation through Cluster Collaboration

Six projects funded under the **HORIZON-WIDERA calls** have joined forces to foster experimentation and exchange of good practices in value creation and knowledge valorisation.

After initially introducing their respective projects and areas of work, the sister projects are now collaborating with the **European Research Executive Agency (REA)** to develop a more unified and collaborative approach bringing together Knowledge Valorisation initiatives.

This informal cluster aims to strengthen contributions to policy feedback, encourage mutual learning, and create synergies that support the improvement of future programme implementation.

MEDVIEW project is proud to be part of this growing collaboration and looks forward to deeper engagement in advancing knowledge valorisation practices across Europe!

Advancing Knowledge Valorization at Athens Digital Health Week



MEDVIEW partners recently participated in **Athens Digital Health Week**, contributing to the open session of the *Initial EARLYSCAN Cluster User Story for the Slovenian AI Factory (SLAIF)*. During the session, MEDVIEW presented insights on “*Knowledge Valorization: From Research to Practice*,” highlighting how research results can be transformed into practical and impactful healthcare solutions.

The discussion brought together researchers, innovators, hospitals, and ecosystem stakeholders to explore how research outputs can be translated into real-world applications. It also supported the development of the MEDVIEW Knowledge Valorization Implementation Guide through co-creation, testing, and validation of different methods and tools. The session emphasized the importance of strong stakeholder engagement, shared infrastructure, and cross-sector collaboration to move from promising research to tangible societal impact in digital health.

This participation reaffirmed MEDVIEW’s commitment to turning research knowledge into practical solutions that can create meaningful impact in healthcare.





WHO Global Traditional Medicine Summit - December, New Delhi, India

MEDVIEW, through our grant partner EUROCAM, was represented at the WHO Global Traditional Medicine Summit 2025 in New Delhi, with the theme “Restoring Balance: The Science and Practice of Health and Well-Being.” This landmark three-day gathering brought together 107 Country representatives, 769 delegates, 25 Ministers, and more than 21,000 online registrants — a powerful demonstration of the growing global commitment to holistic and culturally grounded approaches to health. The presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi further underscored the national and international significance of traditional medicine in India. For MEDVIEW, being part of this environment offered a valuable opportunity to listen,



learn, and engage in conversations about how co-creation, One Health thinking, and well-being-centred approaches can contribute to more inclusive and sustainable health innovation.

Our participation focused on building relationships and exchanging perspectives with organisations and individuals who share our commitment to collaborative, values-driven approaches to health in Europe and globally. Through informal dialogues and networking, we explored shared challenges and opportunities around

strengthening partnerships that support innovation and well-being. Being part of this global gathering helped strengthen MEDVIEW’s presence and affirmed the relevance of our work at a moment when holistic, interconnected approaches to well-being are gaining wider recognition and understanding.





MEDVIEW Holds its First General Assembly in Athens



The MEDVIEW consortium gathered for its first General Assembly meeting on 13 November 2025 in Athens, Greece, bringing together project partners both onsite and online to review progress and plan upcoming activities.

During the meeting, partners presented updates across all work packages, covering project coordination, ethics compliance, stakeholder engagement, knowledge generation, valorisation activities, and communication efforts.

Key discussions focused on strengthening stakeholder involvement, advancing the development of the Knowledge Valorisation Implementation Guide (MEDGUIDE), and progressing the MEDSPACE digital collaboration platform. The meeting also addressed upcoming deliverables, dissemination activities, and collaboration opportunities with other Horizon projects, marking an important step in aligning the consortium around MEDVIEW's mission to support knowledge valorisation and innovation in healthcare.
